1.Global Champions Tour Concept

The main goal of the Global Champions Tour is to develop the equestrian sport and position itself amongst top sport.

The Global Champions Tour brings together the best riders, the best horses, the highest prize money, the best venues and facilities to create the best outdoor show jumping series.

1.1 Global Champions Tour 2009 calendar

This year the Global Champions Tour consists of 9 stages on 3 continents:

02-05 April	GCT of Italy in Arezzo
08-10 May	GCT of Spain in Valencia
21-24 May	GCT of Germany in Hamburg
11-13 June	GCT of France in Cannes
25-27 June	GCT of Monaco
09-11 July	GCT of Portugal in Estoril
31 July-02 August	GCT of Brazil in Rio de Janeiro
21-23 August	GCT of The Netherlands in Valkenswaard
11-15 November	GCT Final of Qatar in Doha

1.2 Invitation system

- 60% of the riders will consist of the riders 1 to 30 on the Rolex Rankings two months prior to the event. In case of riders declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Rolex Rankings in descending order. Riders in this group cannot be lower on the Rolex Rankings than 150th place. Requirements obliging organizing committees to invite at least two riders from each NF are to be relaxed;
- 10% of the participants will be home riders and will be selected from the top 150 riders on the Rolex Rankings. Also included in this group is the FEI Wild Card. The home riders are selected by the home National Federation and the FEI Wild Card by the FEI. Should the Organizing Committee (OC) not be able to meet its quota of home riders in this group, the quota will be filled by inviting additional riders from 60% group in descending order as described above;
- 30% of the participants are selected by the OC. It is not obligatory that these participants be chosen from the Rolex Rankings.

1.3 The GCT Grand Prix, highlight of each stage

- The class that counts for points in the GCT ranking is the Grand Prix, presented by CN and CN WorldWide which takes place on the Saturdays of the events;
- It is a show jumping competition over two different rounds against the clock with one jump off against the clock in case of a tie on penalties for the first place;
- A maximum of eighteen participants return for the second round based on penalties and time in the first round. In any case, all participants with zero penalties in the first round return for the second round. The participants that tie for the 18th place (penalties and time) are allowed to participate in the second round;
- Participants are classified according to their penalties in both rounds and if necessary according to their penalties and time in the jump-off.
- The participants of the second round not taking part in the jump-off are classified according to their penalties in both rounds and time in the second round;
- The participants of the first round not taking part in the second round are classified according to their penalties and time in the first round.

Starting order

- The starting order will be established according to a draw. Participants are divided into two groups based on their position on the Rolex Rankings at the time of the event. The competitors in the group with the higher ranked participants start last in the first round.





- The order of starting in the second round is according to the reverse order of penalties and time in the first round.
- The order of starting in the jump-off is according to the same order as in the second round.

Point system for the GCT ranking

- The 18 riders that start in the second round will receive points;
- After the 8th leg (Valkenswaard, The Netherlands), a full count will be made up of the Global Champions Tour Ranking and the best 25 riders will be invited to participate in the final in Doha, Qatar.
- Number of points that can be earned during the first 8 legs:

1.4 The Global Champions Tour Final

The Global Champions Tour Final of 2009 will take place in Doha, Qatar from 11 to 15 November.

The invitations are being done by the final Global Champions Tour Rankings, appearing after Valkenswaard on 23rd of August 2009.

The best 25 riders of the Global Champions Tour Rankings will be invited.

In case of riders declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Global Champions Tour Rankings.

Round 1

- It is one round against the clock;
- A maximum of twenty five participants start in this 1,60m class;
- The order of starting in this class is the reversed order of the Global Champions Tour Rankings. The rider with most points starts last;
- The class is the qualifier for the Grand Prix on the 11th November. The best 18 qualify.

Round 2

- It is one round with a jump-off;
- A maximum of eighteen participants return for this 1,60m class based on penalties and time in round 1;
- The order of starting in this class is the reversed order of the first round. The winner starts last;
- The riders all start on the same level.

2.2 Rolex

Rolex and equestrian sport

Rolex has been present in equestrian sports since 1957. In these sports, excellence flows from flawless timing, precision and the grace of the horses and riders.





Today, Rolex is actively involved in four disciplines:

- jumping,
- dressage,
- eventing,
- polo.

Rolex is a partner of the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI), the major international association governing the sport, and also supports some thirty of the most renowned events on the international circuit.

Since 2002, Rolex has sponsored the FEI World Equestrian Games, considered to be the most prestigious equestrian competition in the world. This event, unique in its genre, takes place every four years at a different venue and brings together for two weeks the seven disciplines officially recognized by the international equestrian authorities: jumping, dressage, eventing, endurance, vaulting, driving and reining.

In 2010, for the first time, an eighth discipline, para-equestrian sport, will be part of the programme.

In jumping particularly, Rolex is associated with several annual international competitions and events:

- the CHIO Aachen (Germany),
- the CSI-W Geneva (Switzerland),
- the CSIO Spruce Meadows (Canada),
- the Brussels International Jumping (Belgium),
- the Rolex IJRC Top 10 Final.

Since 2007, Rolex has been Title Sponsor of the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final, one of the most exhilarating equestrian jumping competitions.

Rolex is also the “Official Timekeeper” of the Global Champions Tour, a series of high-level international outdoor jumping competitions.

In the discipline of eventing, Rolex in the 1980s became the Title Sponsor of the Rolex Kentucky Three-Day Event (four-star event), which takes place annually in Lexington, Kentucky (United States). Rolex also sponsors two other major international competitions in this discipline: the Mitsubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials (since 1999) and the Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials (since 2000). These two four-star contests take place in the United Kingdom.

In 2001, Rolex created the Rolex Grand Slam of Eventing. This trophy is awarded to the rider who wins consecutively at Lexington, Badminton and Burghley. To date, only British horsewoman Pippa Funnell has succeeded in this accomplishment, in 2003.

In polo, Rolex sponsors several prestigious events in Argentina, one of the leading countries in this discipline: the Copa de Oro Ellerstina and the Open Championship.





Rolex Testimonees include five men and women with exceptional records:

- Brazilian rider Rodrigo Pessoa, Olympic jumping champion, is considered to be one of the most remarkable riders of his generation;
- A German rider of American origin, Meredith Michaels-Beerbaum is the first woman to be ranked world number one in jumping (in 2005). In 2006, for the second time, she took first place on the podium at the Rolex IJRC Top 10 Final in Geneva. Meredith Michaels-Beerbaum won the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final in 2005 and 2008;
- British rider Zara Phillips, a talented young horsewoman in the discipline of eventing, was awarded the title of individual world champion in 2006 at the FEI World Equestrian Games in Aachen;
- British rider Pippa Funnell is the first woman to be ranked number one in her speciality, eventing, and, to date, is the first rider ever to have won, in 2003, the Rolex Grand Slam of Eventing;
- German rider Isabell Werth is one of the most decorated riders in dressage. She won the team gold medal and an individual silver medal at the Beijing Olympic Games in 2008. In 2007, she finished first at the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final in Las Vegas

4. Coming event: Global Champions Tour of the Netherlands, Valkenswaard

4.1 Presentation

Equestrian Sport is a life style. In Valkenswaard this life style can be enjoyed by everybody: riders, horses, sponsors, grooms, press and of course the audience. The show is hosted by Stal Tops, the show jumping stable owned by GCT President and Founder Jan Tops. It is known as one of the best jumping stables in the world and every inch of the property is quality.

International Concours Valkenswaard will be held for the 16th time this year on August 21.22.23rd The weekend before the Horse Festival will take place on August 14.15.16th. Highlights of the International Concours Valkenswaard are the VDL Groep Grand Prix, eighth leg of the Global Champions Tour on Saturday August 22nd. The CN WorldWide Derby will create again a spectacular finish on Sunday August 23rd. During the entire event, showjumping sport at the highest level is ensured with a total of six competitions which count for the Rolex ranking. The natural arenas, the surrounding buildings and the rural environment create a wonderful and relaxed atmosphere for the more than 30.000 spectators to enjoy.

Last year, it was Stal Tops' own rider Daniel Deusser (GER) with black stallion Air Jordan Z, who won the VDL Groep Tour Grand Prix beating Nick Skelton (GBR) riding Arko III and Edwina Alexander (AUS) riding Islovas Socrates. Since Valkenswaard will be the last leg before the Global Champions Tour final in Doha (Qatar) many riders will try to gain more points and do their very best to finish within the top 25 of the Global Champions Tour ranking, which gives them access to the prestigious final. Will last leg winner and best rider of Rio de Janeiro, Gianni Govoni, gain enough points for final qualification? Many things are still to be decided at this all important, final round in the Netherlands.
